Year 2	Values Award shared weekly

 Values Award shared weekly 2 posts a week – 1 as a whole school activity by the teacher and 1 of each child uploading a piece of work themselves onto student portfolio. Students to take photos of their own learning and upload to portfolio using the class code with teachers approving before being posted. Post a detailed video or photo of each child's learning every half term - with a short explanation of any skills met through the activity/task. Over the course of the year, try to get a mixture of curriculum areas. Teachers to approve parent posts
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Class Story

If teaching a tricky topic e.g in Maths - upload a 'mini lesson' - preferably a child explaining a new concept or supporting revision. Get the pupils to be doing the 'teaching' as needed. This will give parents an insight into how to teach a tricky topic at home — could be related to homework or a topic in class. Please allow HOYs to see and approve videos before sending.

Additional information to be shared on Dojo

Weekly roundup – each class to send a weekly roundup with a few sentences about the week and the week ahead with focus on academic learning. Add links to support parents with the learning, such as WRM or RWI when necessary.

Subject specialists

Subject specialists to post stories / photos / videos / links onto the 'class announcement' section – this will be distributed to all children in the class.

Arabic and Islamic will post the weekly newsletter <u>every Sunday</u>. During exam time, twice a year they may post more often. Arabic school events will go on class story collectively. For Early Years Arabic, a maximum of 1 photo per class to be posted a month.

In order for parents to get an insight into what children are doing across subject lessons, specialists teachers will follow a calendar of when to post. E.g in December, Music will add 1 post for each Year 1 and 2 class, only once in December and March-see below. For subjects, this can be a whole class post, or a few pictures of the lesson, it does not have to be individual to each student.
